





The Case for Education

- + Future cohorts of learners will need access to a distributed universe of learning objects
- + Real-time, multimedia virtual collaboration



The Nordic perspective

- + Common understanding of the strategic importance of ICT
- + High level of ICT penetration
- + Similar cultural, material and political basis
- + The Nordic countries are sparsely populated, and we need to use our resources as effectively as possible

Nordunet2 goals

The overriding aim of the Nordunet2 program me is to help secure the position of Nordic countries at the forefront of Internet development. Its focus is on network utilization and network-based applications.



RecommendationsNordunet2 Evaluation Report

- + More emphasis on infrastructure services, both on the network and on the application layer, with more emphasis on "mobility" and GRIDS,
- + NORD Unet and the NRENs should play a much more prominent role,
- + More attention should be given to international co-operation with other world-class initiatives,
- + More emphasis on the dissemination of progress and results, both on a national/Nordic level and the international level,
- + More attention should be given to quality assurance, not only during the selection but also in the operational phase of the projects,
- + The organizational structure needs to be strengthened.



The next phase: Preparing the new initiative

- + Develop a proposition for the <u>content and profile</u> of a continued and strengthened Nordic research co-operation on Internet and application research and development
- + Propose anew <u>organizational structure</u> for the cooperation
- + Propose a <u>model for budget and funding</u>. This includes possibilities for cofinancing from commercial as well as other national agents
- + Create an <u>overview of ongoing and planned research</u> efforts with relevance to the Nordic collaboration in this field
- + Proposal to the Nordic Ministers of Education and Research for a reinforced collaboration on Internet and Application R & D



Concluding rem arks: The Common Challenge

- + Wemust build a<u>strong</u> and transparent case for the decision—makers
- + Wemustwork along both <u>top-down</u> axis as well as the <u>bottom-up</u> axis
- + We need to <u>reach out and involve</u> research councils, universities, and industry


